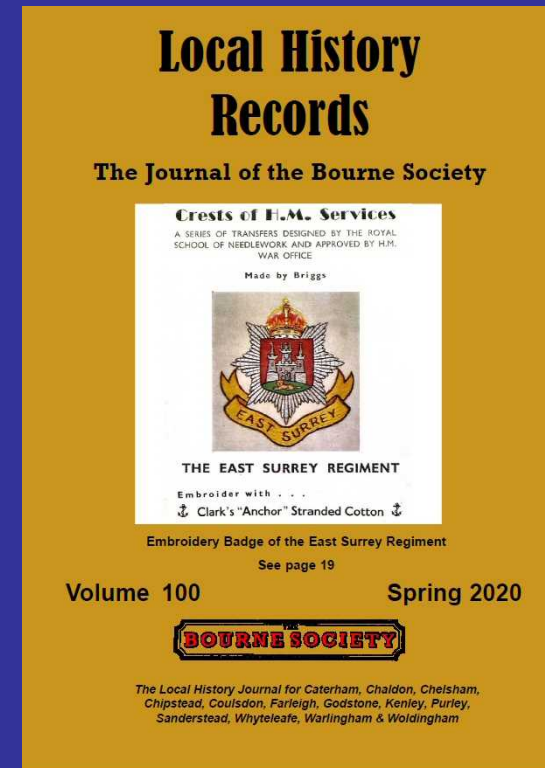
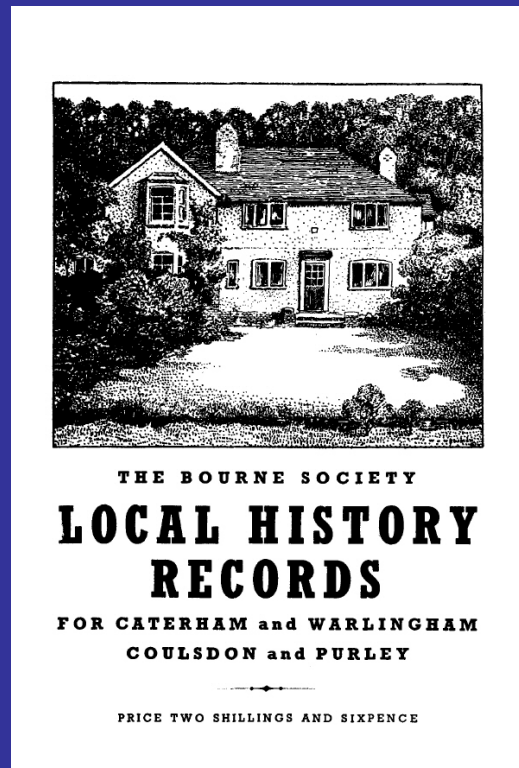

The weather was ideal for walking and the route was packed with features of interest, many of which would have escaped us were it not for our very knowledgeable guide. It may not be realised generally that, for instance, Sir Edward Banks, who was the contractor responsible for the building of the railway and who is buried in Chipstead churchyard, also built four bridges over the Thames, namely: London, Waterloo, Southwark and Staines. 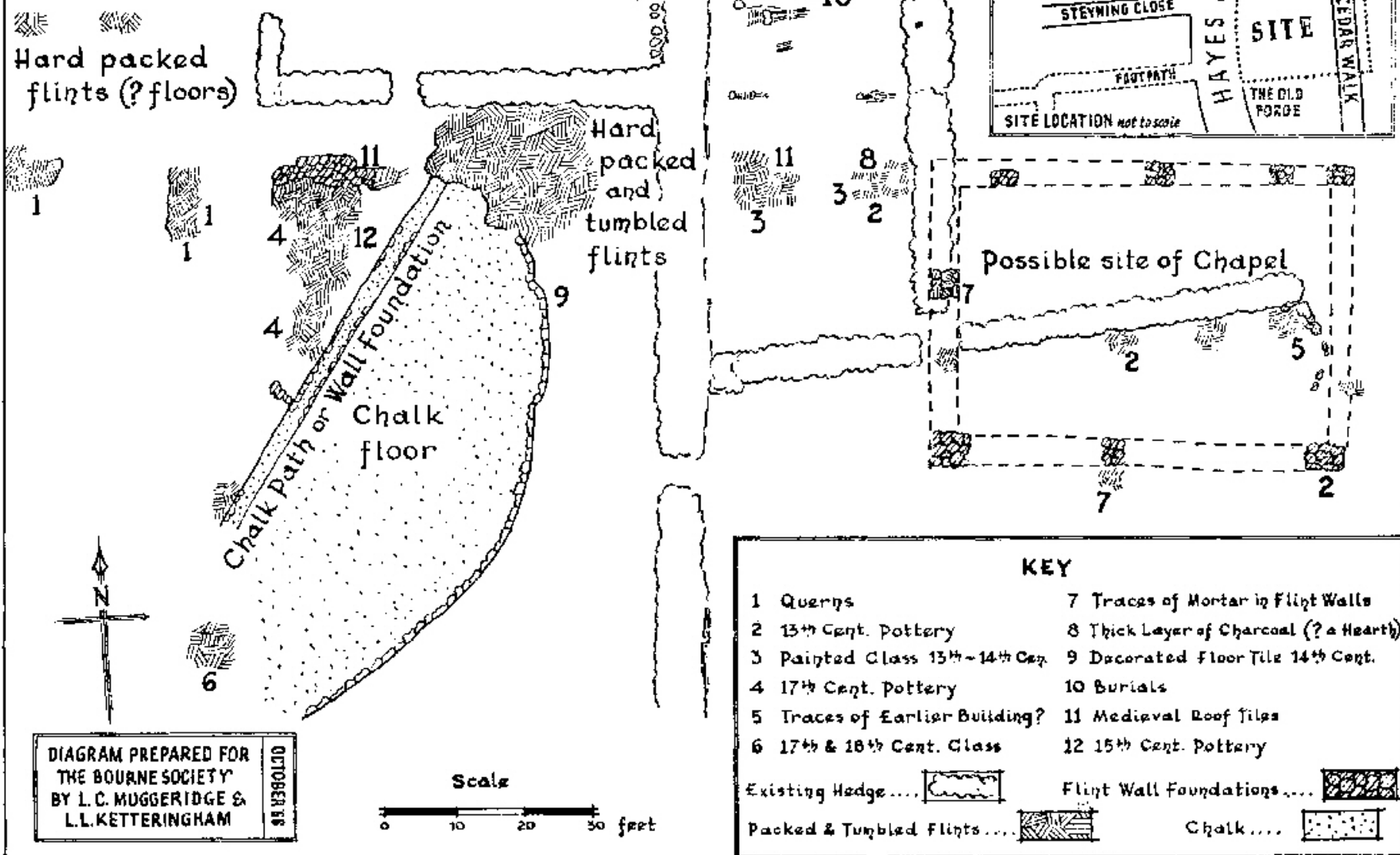

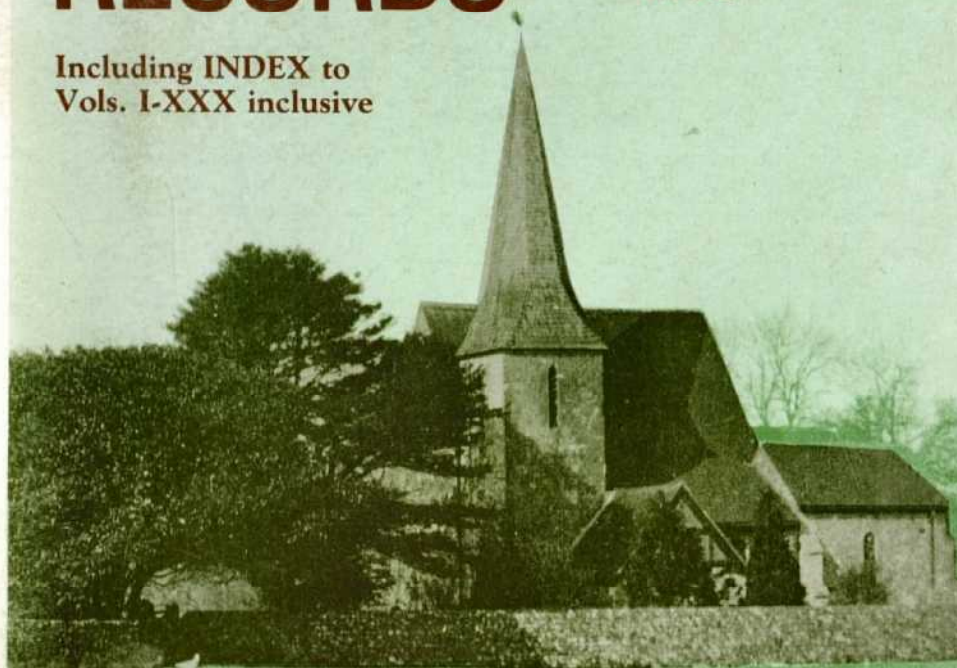

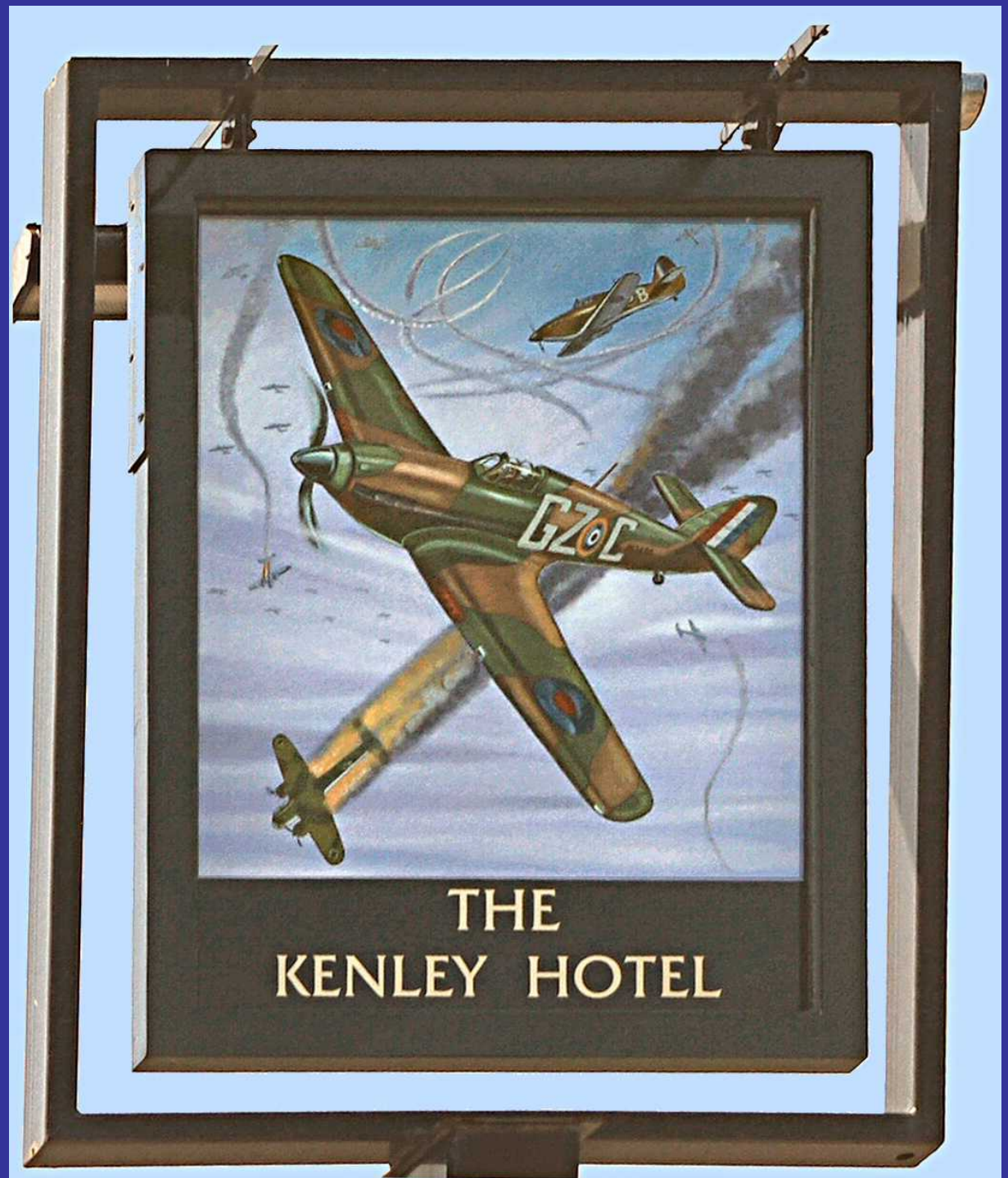

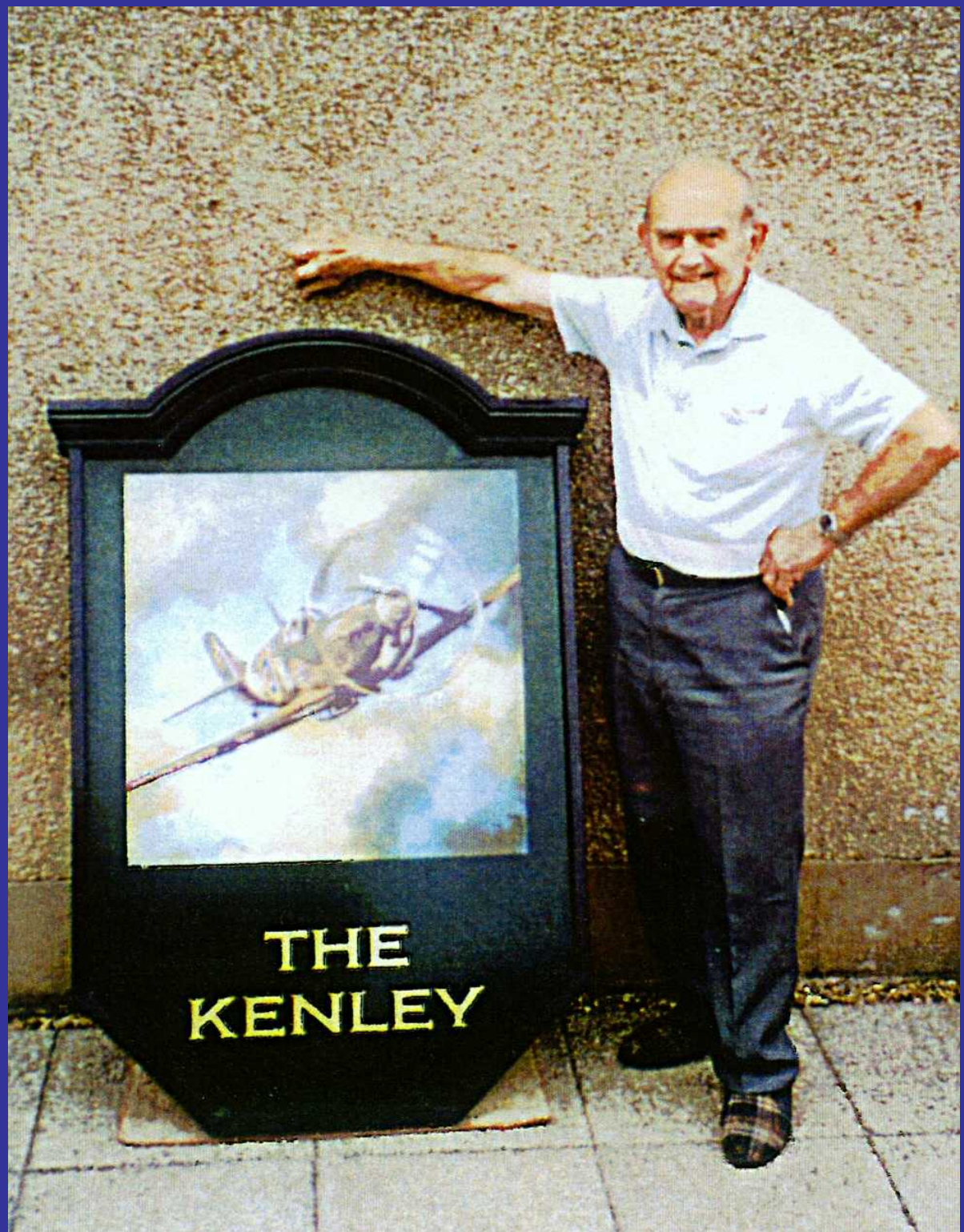

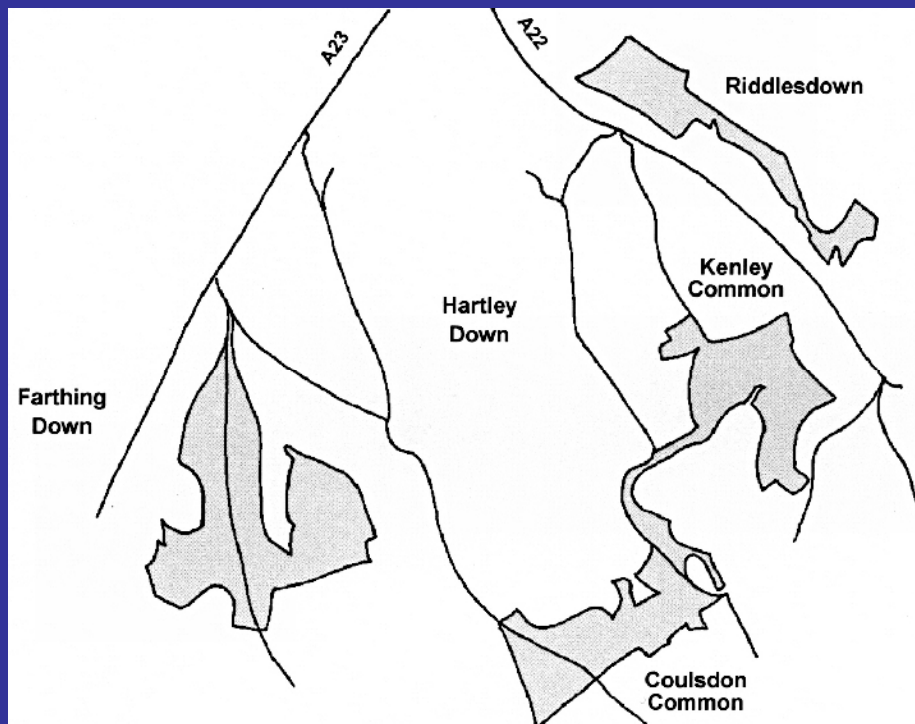

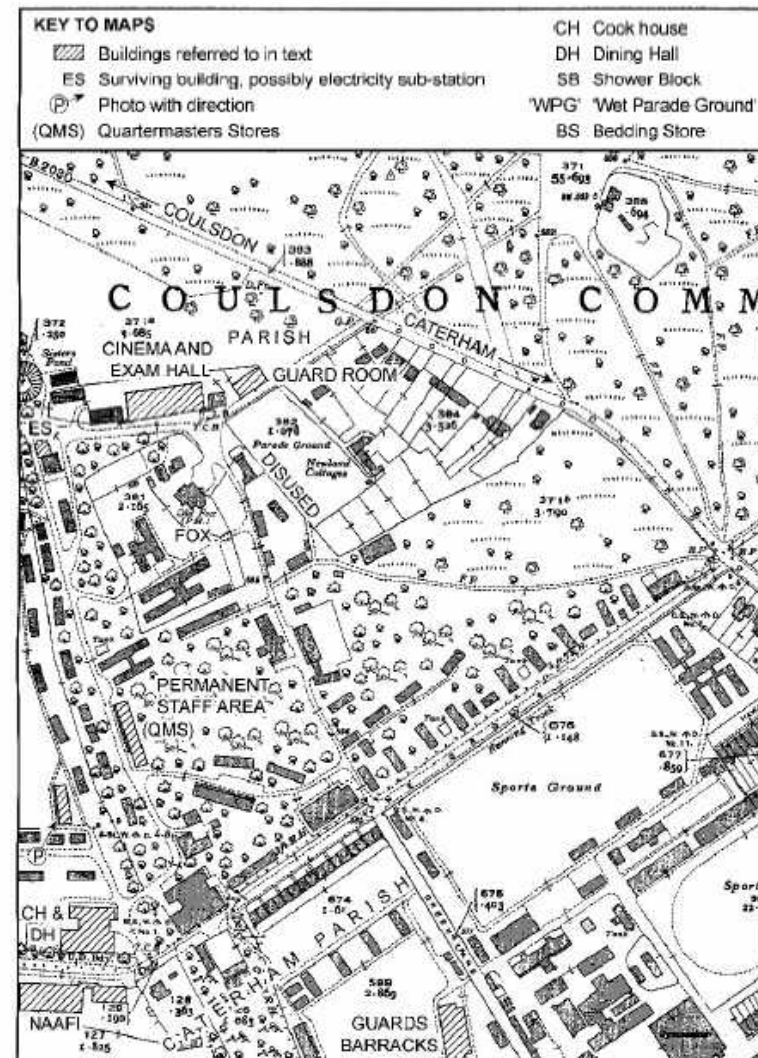


Fig. 2. Eastern part of the camp, with part of the Guards Depot over the parish boundary in Caterham. See fig. 12 for explanation of photo arrow. Edited by Dave Watt.

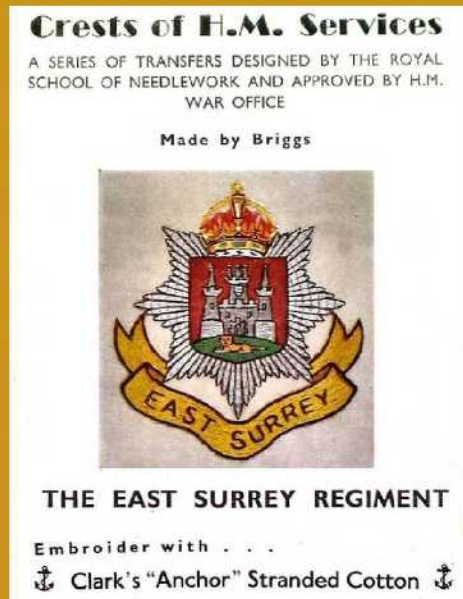
