


The weather was ideal for walking and the route was packed with features of Interest, many of which would have escaped us were it not for our very knowledgeable guide. It may not be realised generally that, for instance, Sir Edward Banks, who was the confractor responsible for the building of the railway and who is buried in Chipstend churchyard, also built four bridges over the Thares, namely. London, Naterlao, Southwark and Staines. Wr.Tharby has compiled a life story of Sir Edward and a copy of this is now in the Sectory's possession. For the bonefit of those who were unable to be present Mr.Tharby has kindly offered to report the trip on some fiture occasion.







Volume 26 (1987), edited by Tom Boyle, was the first to have a colour cover.

It included an article 'The Advent of the Zeppelins' by Peter Flint.

Another article told the story of 'When War Came to Woldingham' by Ron Humphrey, and included a map of Woldingham Camp—



Woldingham Camp: It was planned and built in a space of less than three months.



Volume 31 (1992), edited by Lawson Hunter, was the first to appear in full A5 format. It comprised 44 wire stitched pages.

LHR 31 included an index to volumes 1-30 inclusive.












Fig. 2. Eastern part of the camp, with part of the Guards Depot over the parish boundary in Caterham. See fig. 12 for explanation of photo arrow. Edited by Dave Watt.




