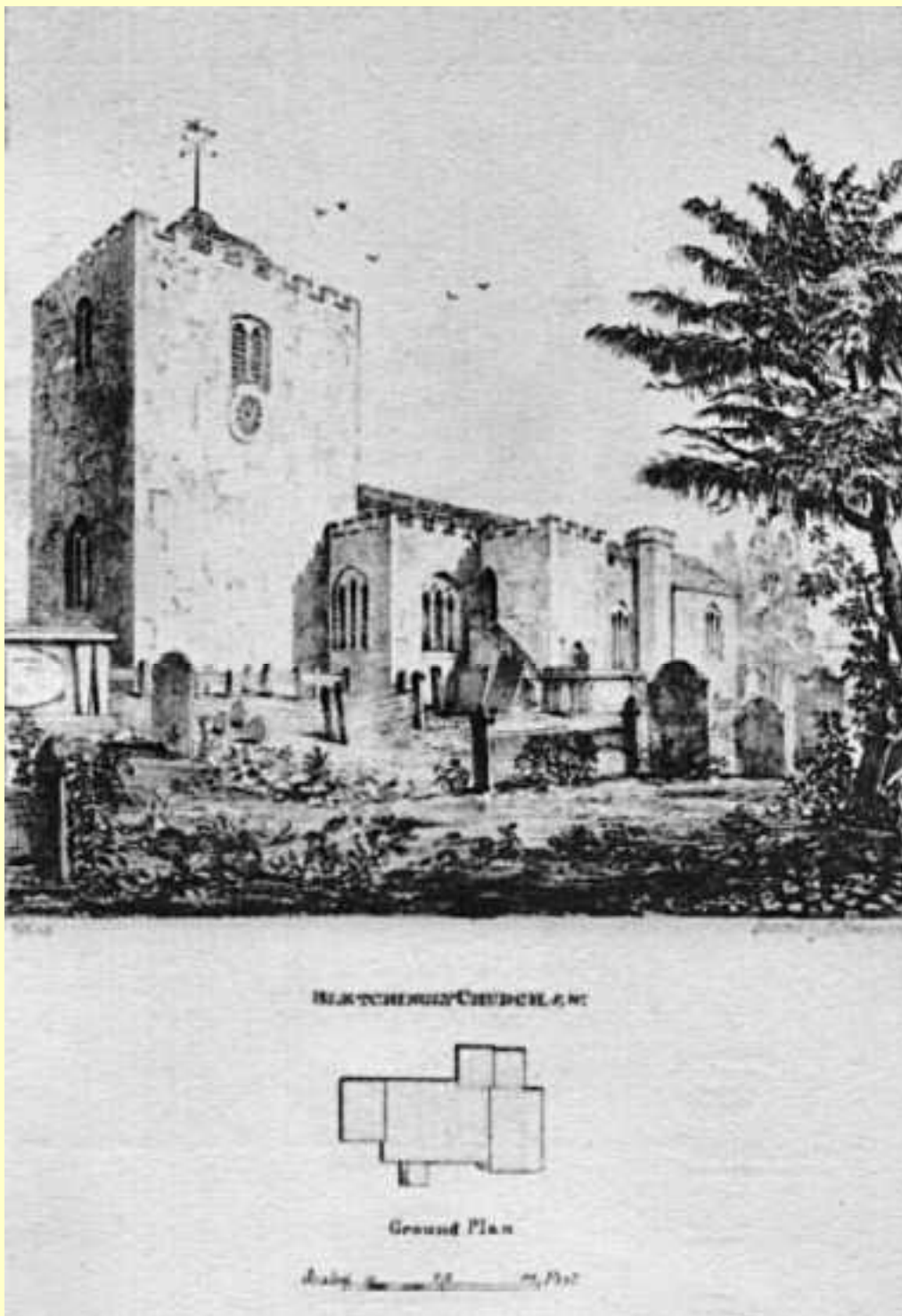

**The porch has a room above it, accessed by a stairway to the side.**

**Such rooms were used for a variety of purposes, in Elizabethan times perhaps for storing 'harness' (armour, weapons etc) against the Spanish in 1588.**

### **South Doorway**

**The figure of the Virgin and Child in the image niche is modern.**

**Note the eroded figures on the ends of the drip mould.**

## **The Hermit's Cell**



**The quatrefoil

represents the  
site of the cell of  
Brother Roger,  
hermit of  
Blechingley,  
c.1233.**

**It is suggested  
that he was a  
Franciscan, one  
of the earliest in  
the country.**

## **St Mary the Virgin**

### **The Clayton Memorial**

**Dominating the south aisle, the memorial, by Richard Crutcher, was put up by Sir Robert Clayton in his own lifetime in 1706 in honour of his wife.**

**It is considered an excellent example of work of that period.**

**The blue and gold wrought-iron railings are contemporary.**

Reginald between c.1893 and 1914.**

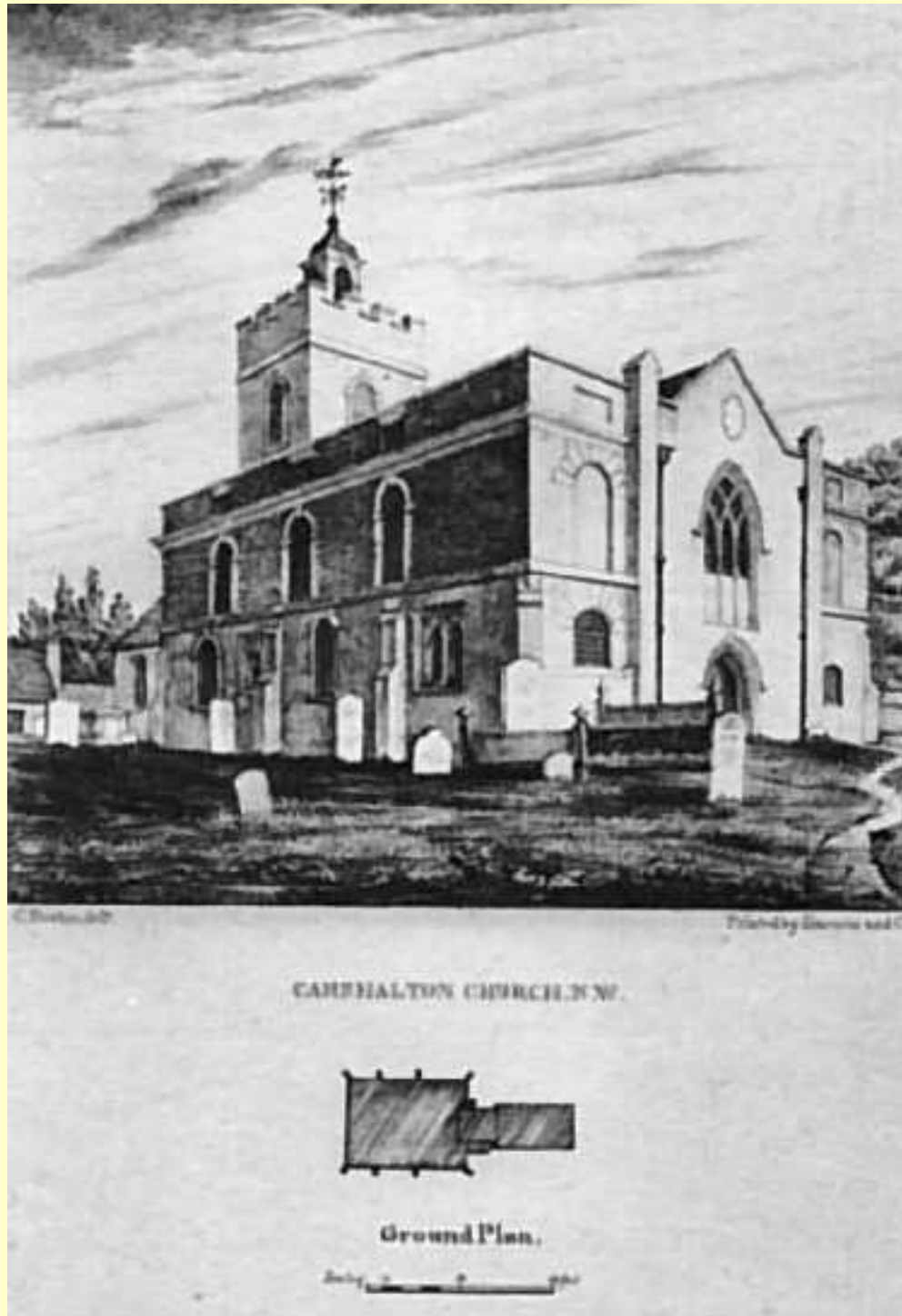

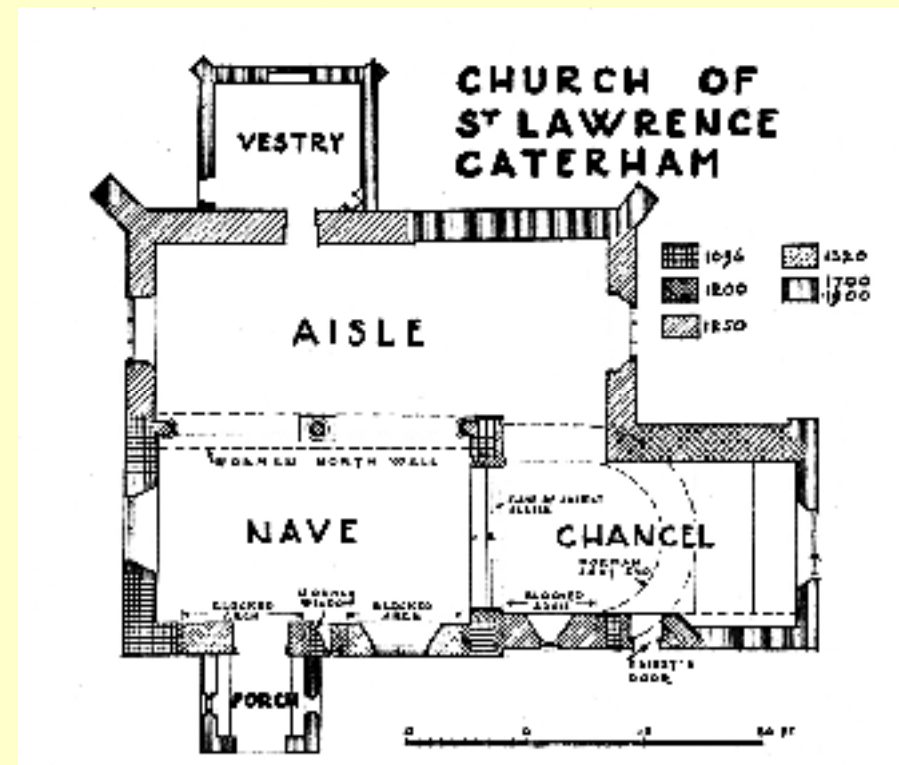

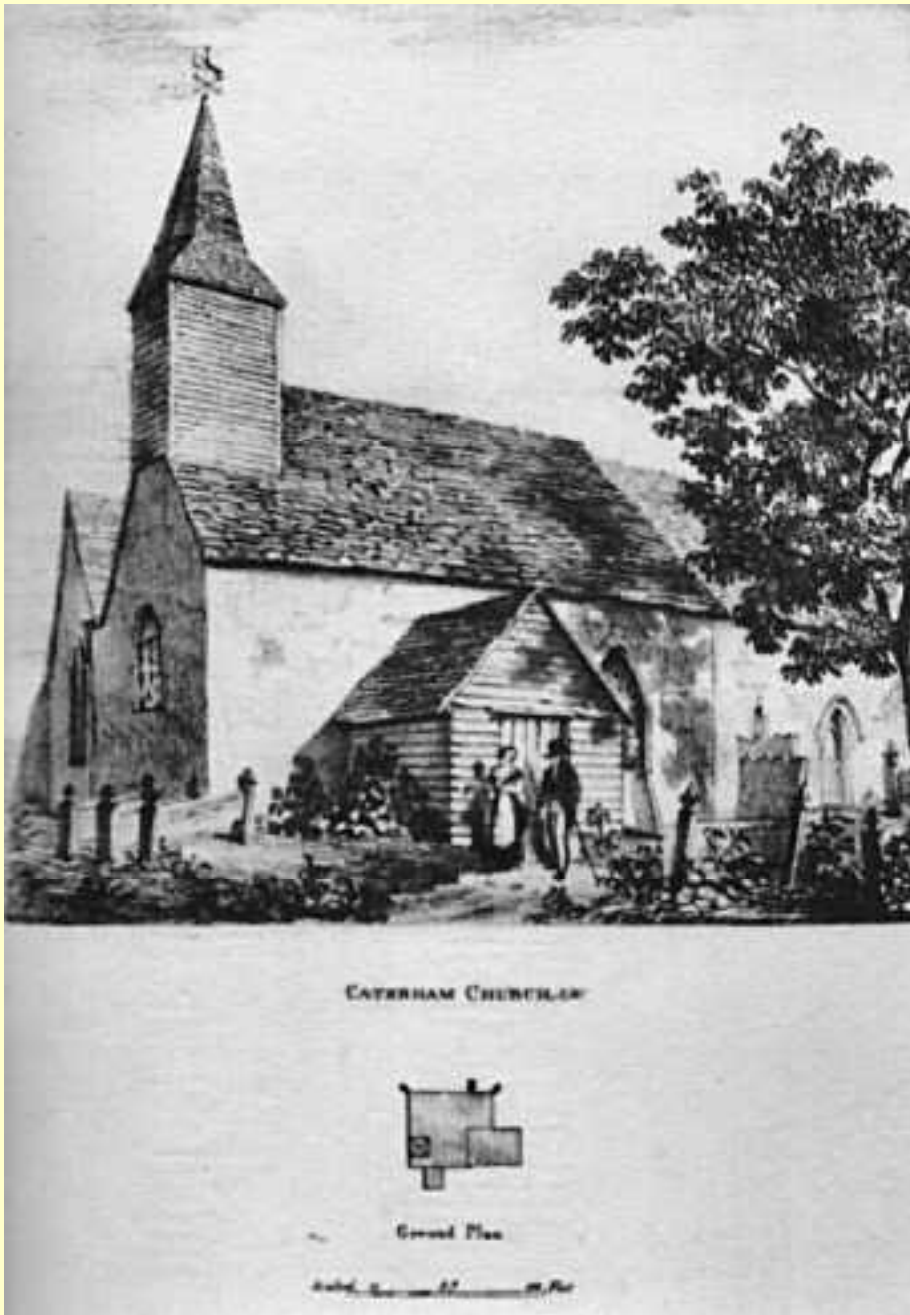


A stone-built church has stood here since the end of the 11<sup>th</sup> century

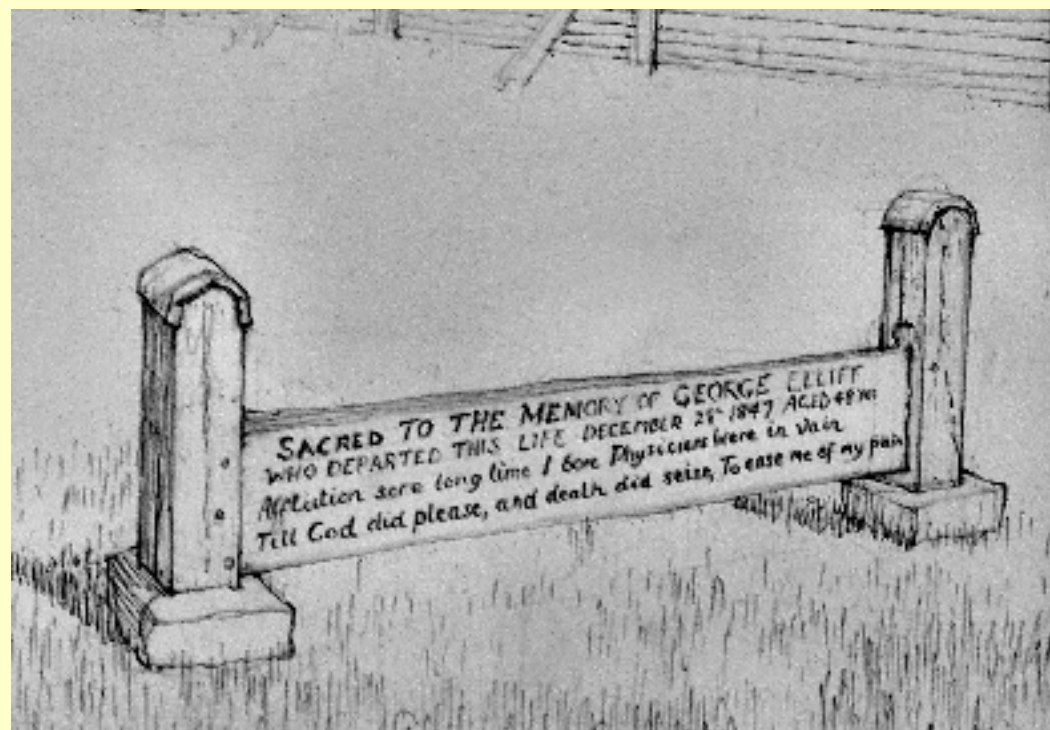

The braced collar roof is probably of 12<sup>th</sup> or 13<sup>th</sup> century date. Until 1927 these oak beams were hidden by match-boarding and lath and plaster ceilings.

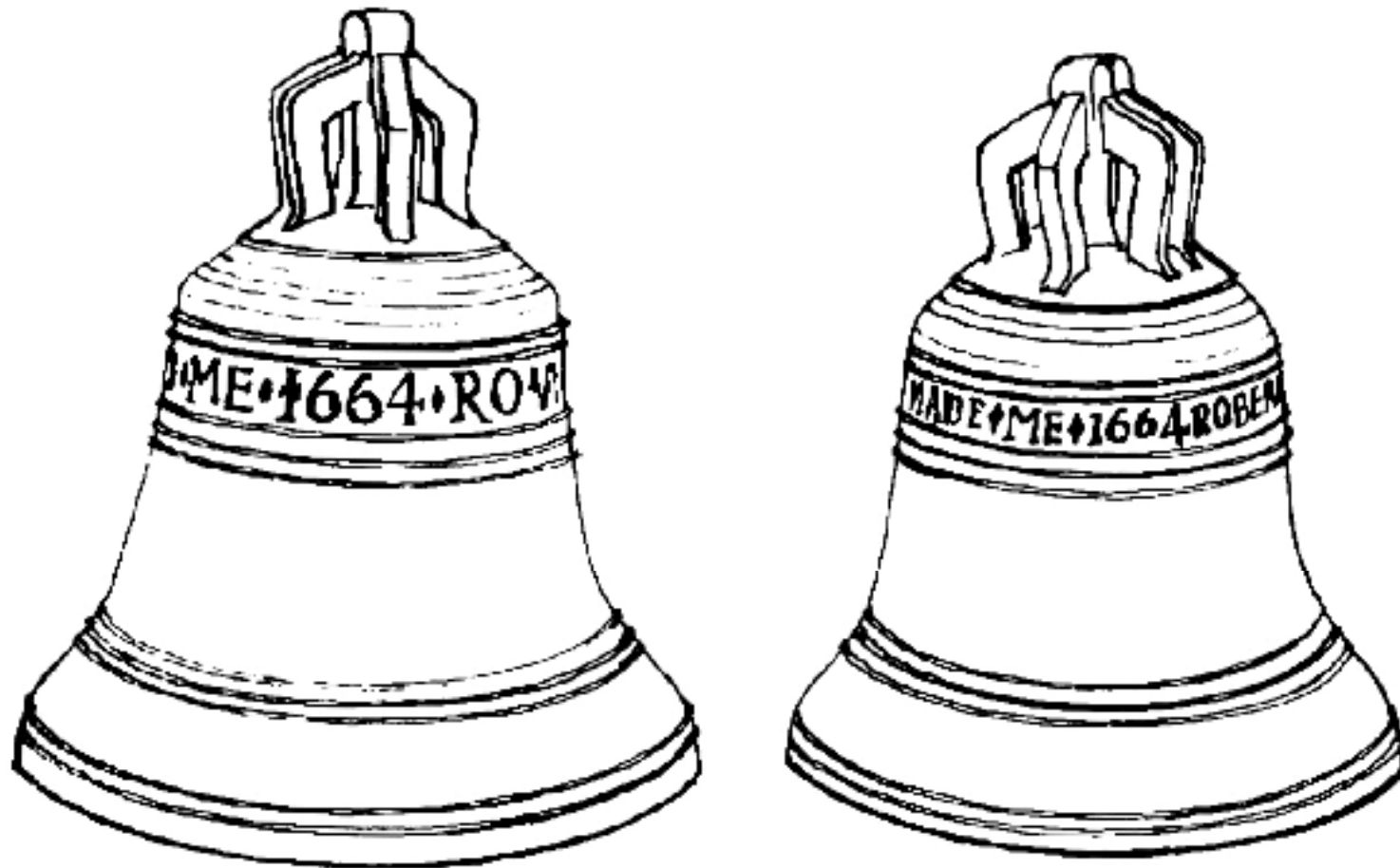

# **CATERHAM on the Hill**

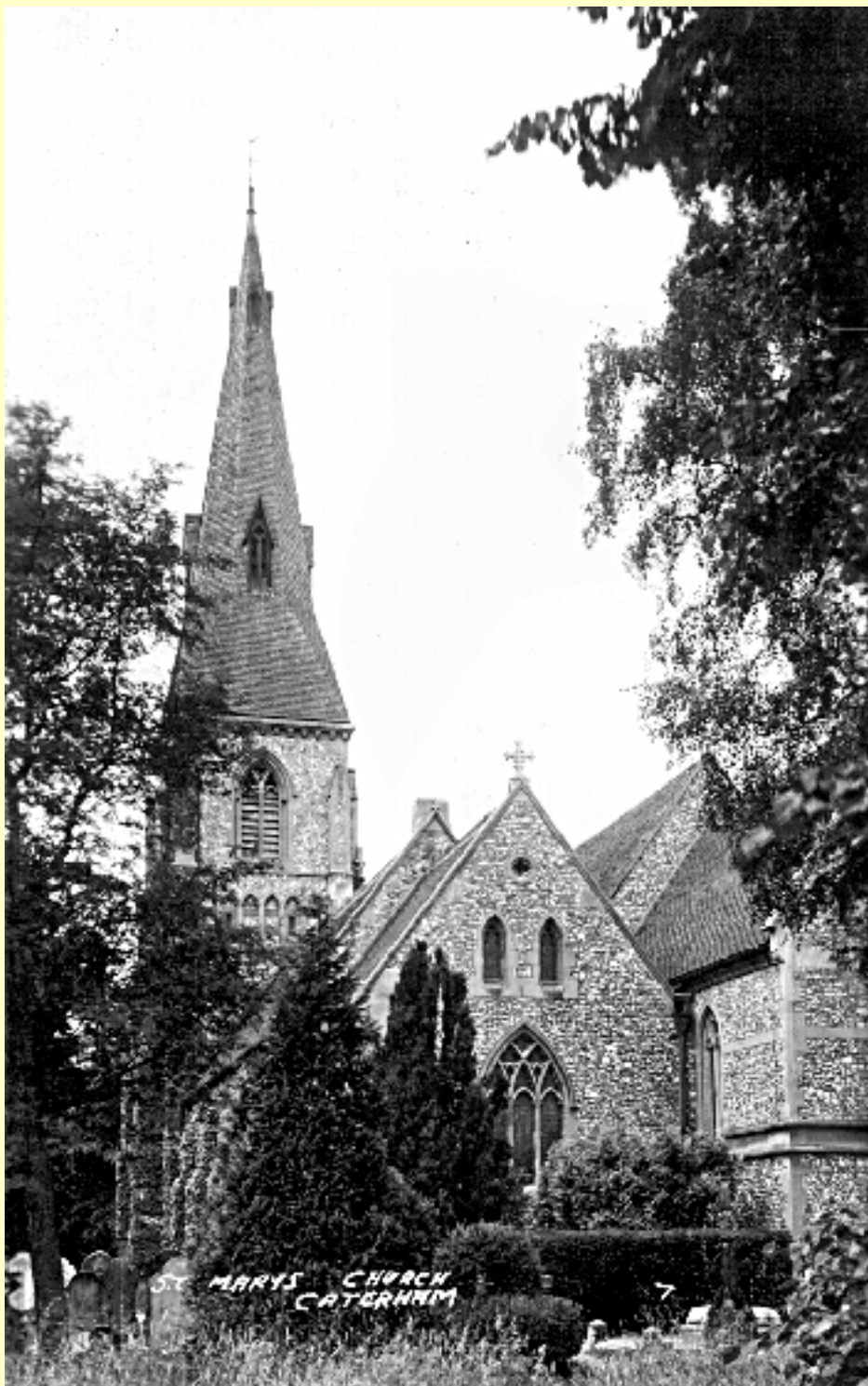
## **St Mary**



**By W & C A Basset Smith.**

**Consecrated in 1866. The 126ft spire was added in 1883, at a cost of £3500. A carillon of eight tubular bells was added in 1891. The north aisle was built in 1916.**

## Font

**13<sup>th</sup> century, circular bowl on a circular stem with four attached shafts.**

**‘This ancient font belonged to the Parish Church of St Lawrence, Caterham, which was built in the reign of King John. It was presented by the Revd Jarvis Kenrick, Rector to the Church of St John the Evangelist, Caterham Valley, AD 1871 and restored in memory of him by his widow AD 1881.’**

**St John's has a peal of eight bells, which were originally hung in the Church of St Mary-at-Lambeth and re-hung here in 1975. The service bell (a ninth bell, in a chamber above) is the original bell of St John's.**

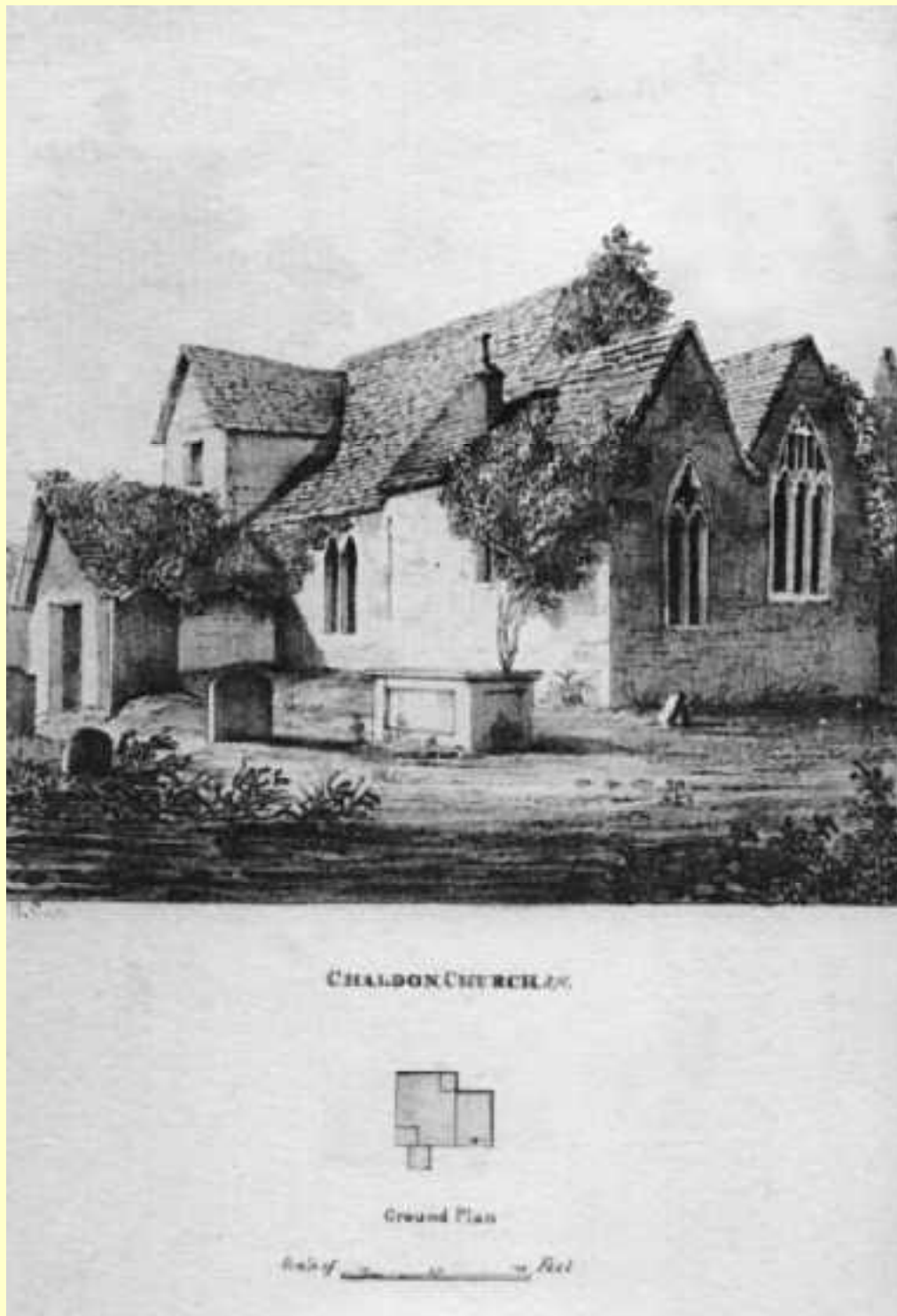

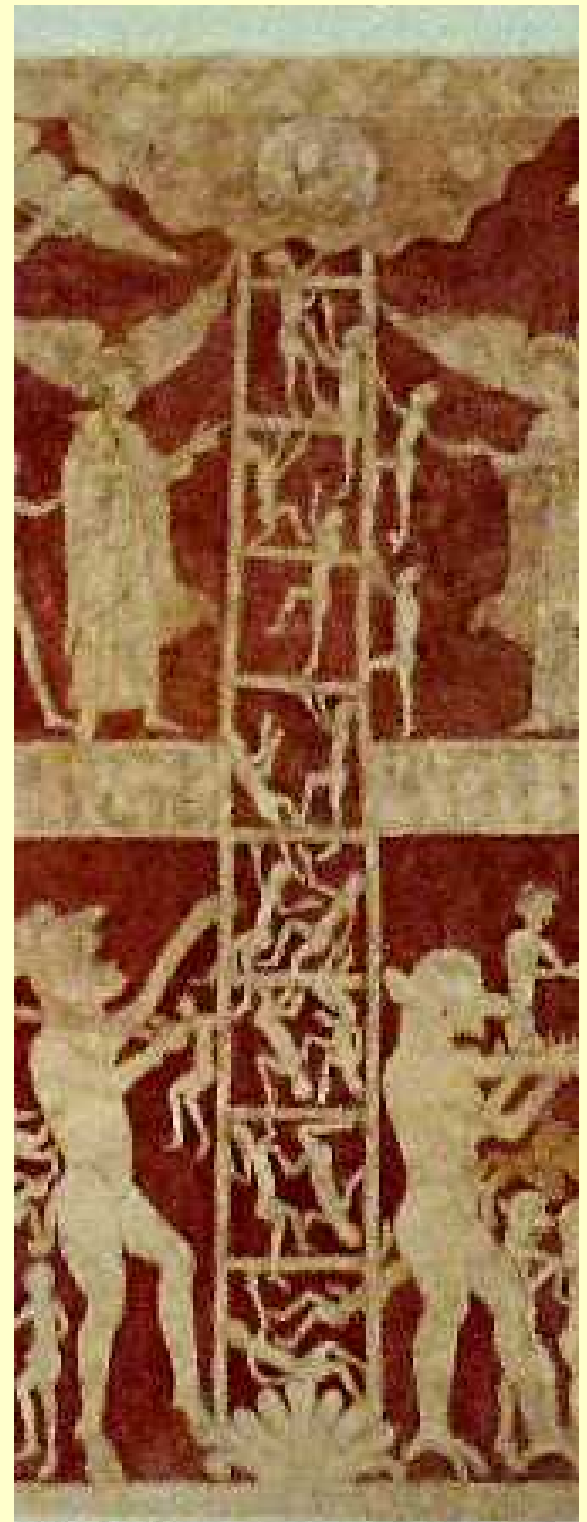

# **CHALDON**

**The bell, over 750 years  
old, and reputedly the  
oldest in Surrey, was  
stolen in 1970. Another  
bell, St Peter, was stolen  
earlier.**

**A facsimile of them may  
be seen in the south  
aisle.**



# CHALDON

records a  
charitable bequest  
by the Richardson  
family of Chaldon  
to assist the poor

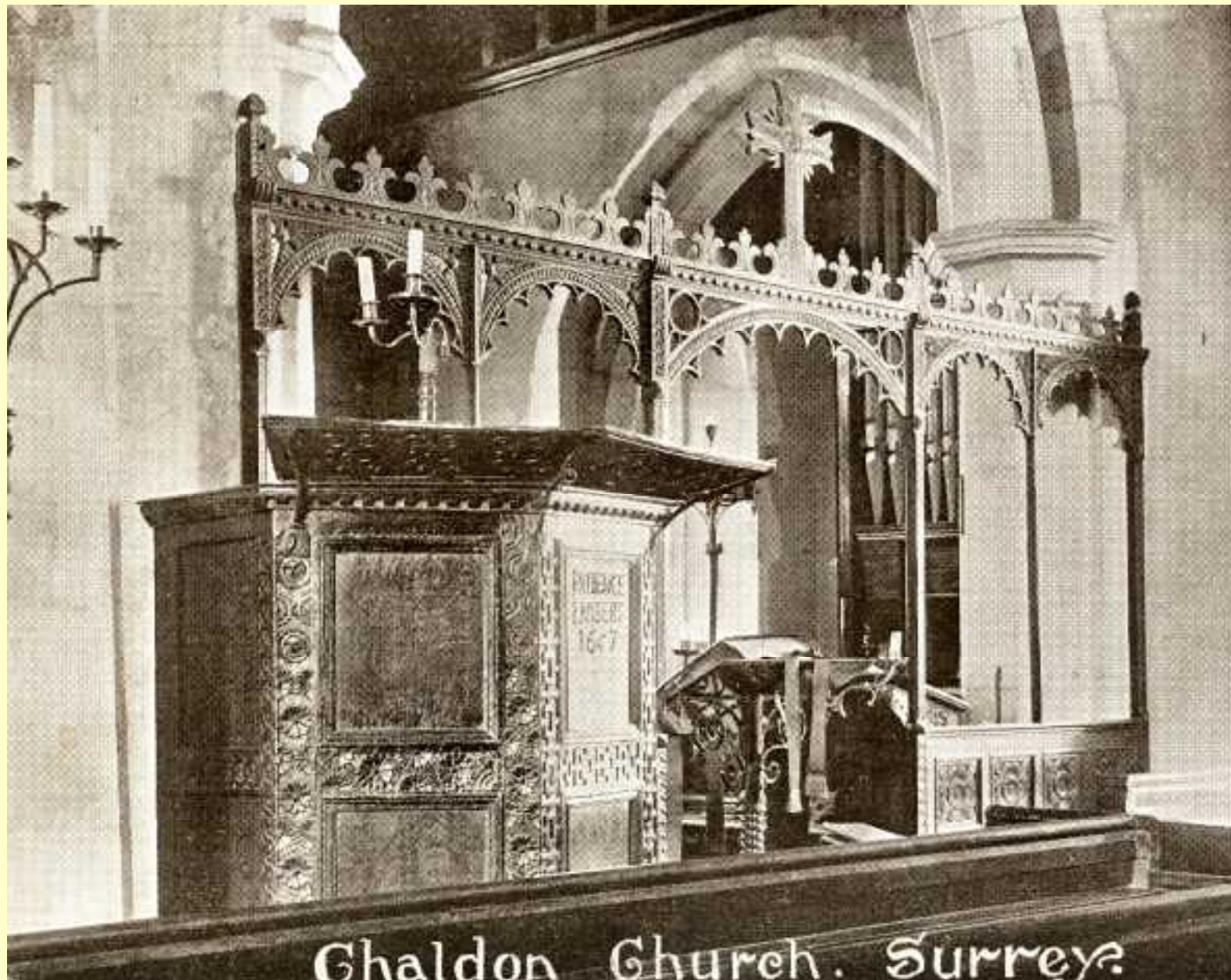

# CHALDON St Peter & St Paul



## Pulpit

**Made of lizard oak, and said to have been donated by Patience Lambert of Tollsworth Manor.**

**It is dated 1657, and is one of very few pulpits of Cromwellian times.**

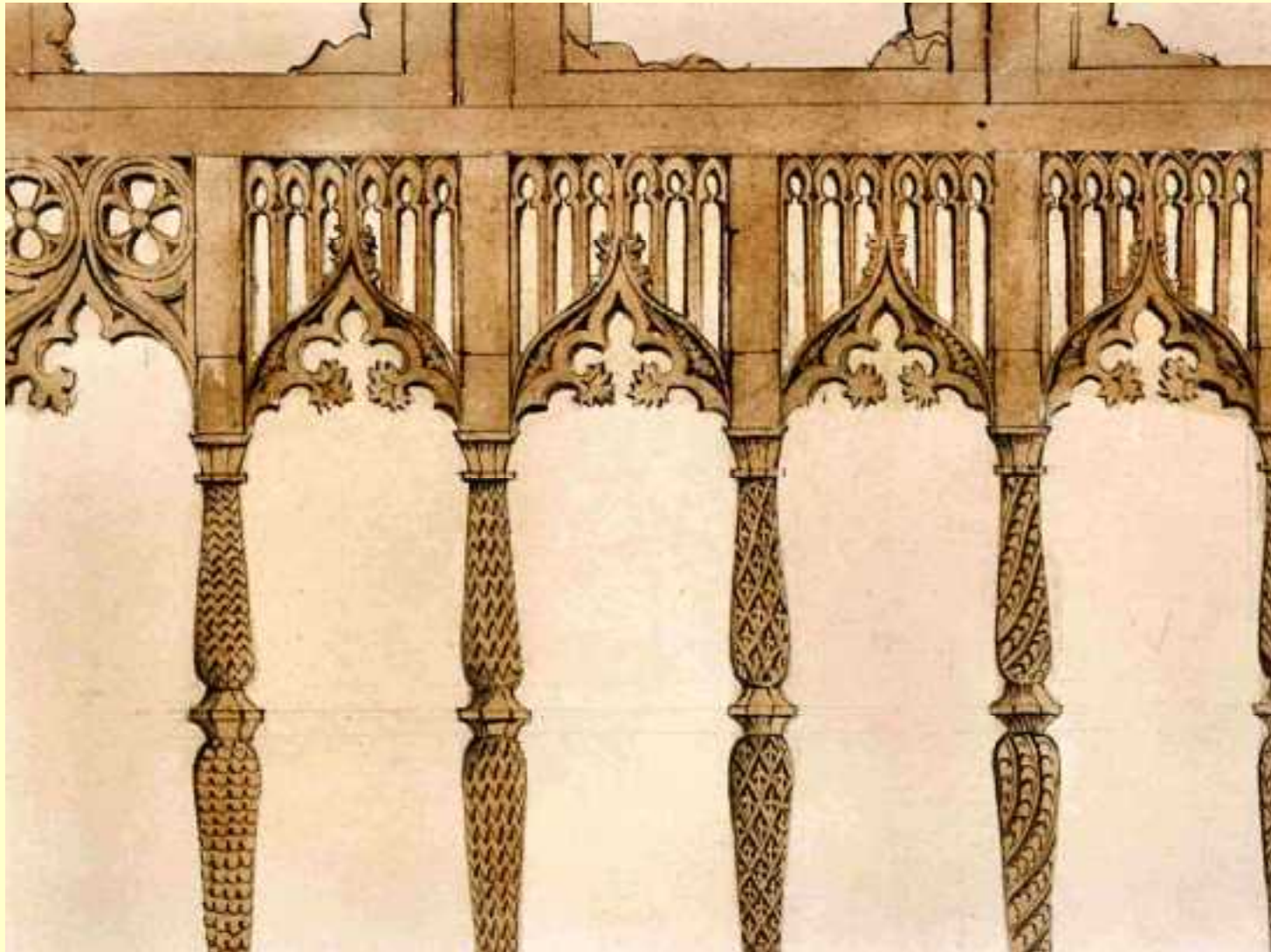

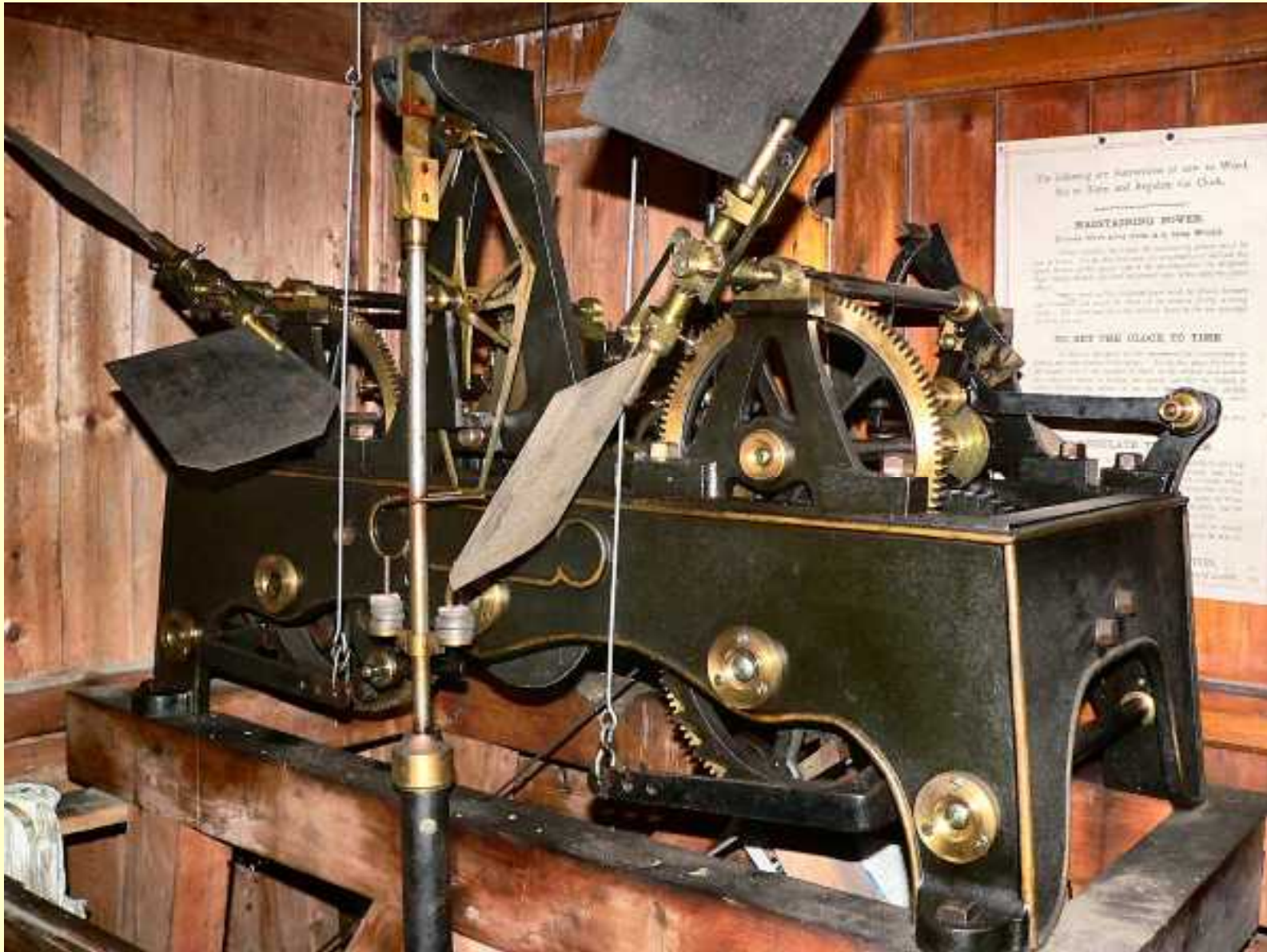
