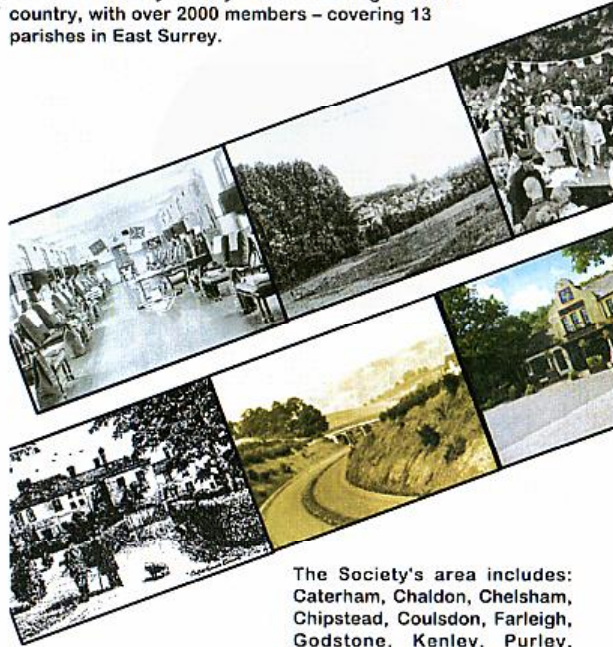


Find out more about where you live

The Bourne Society not only records the area's local history, but also keeps a watchful eye on future developments.

The Bourne Society produces many publications, including our journal *Local History Records*, now including colour illustrations and published three times a year, which is free to members. It also meets regularly, and organises tours and outings.

DID YOU KNOW THAT—

Mammoths once roamed the Bourne valleys.

There was a Celtic field system that can still be traced on Farthing Down.

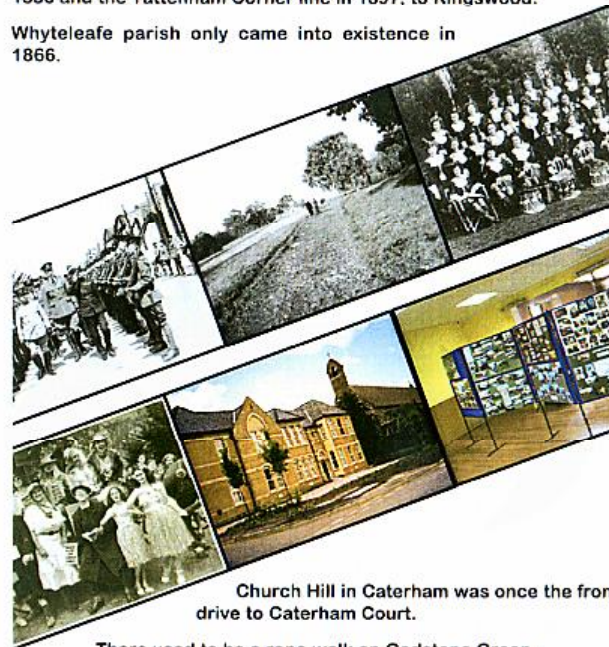
There was a Roman Road that crossed Riddlesdown, followed the Caterham Valley and over Tilburstow Hill to near Brighton.

There is a 12th century doom painting in Chaldon Church.

One of the earliest cricket matches is recorded in 1767 between Hambledon and Caterham.

The Brighton Railway line was built in 1839, the Caterham line in 1856 and the Tattenham Corner line in 1897. to Kingswood.

Whyteleafe parish only came into existence in 1866.



Church Hill in Caterham was once the front drive to Caterham Court.

There used to be a rope walk on Godstone Green.

Kenley airfield was first occupied by the military in 1917 as an Aircraft Acceptance Park.

Farleigh Parish is owned by Merton College, University of Oxford.

A large part of Woldingham parish used to be in Chelsham.

Edmund Byron's well-known hunt was based at Garston Manor nearly opposite the *Wattenden Arms*.

Groups within the Society may concentrate on such specialist fields as archaeology, photography, landscape history, commercial history, sound recording of people's memories, pub history, etc. Membership of these is open to all members without formality, and you are most welcome.

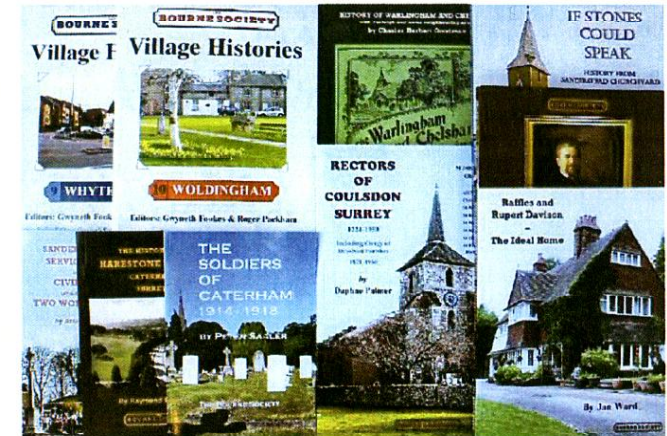
